The details are as under:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Remedial Courses are conducted regularly course wise for the slow learners, and it is conducted during regular hours of study by the respective faculty. For each group of around 20 students a mentor is appointed. The mentors also maintain record of the student class attendance, class-performance and academic progress, number of backlogs and attendance of remedial classes, etc. The mentors adopt structured as well as adaptive mentoring techniques. This mechanism is helping the weak students to improve their academic performance. Bridge courses are conducted for slow learners of the first year students. Bridge courses are being conducted for 2 to 4 weeks in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Computer programming and in other courses, as per the requirement before the commencement of classes for the regular semester

This has reference to the letter No.MNRU/UGC/1/2024 dated 08.09.2024 and submission of notarized affidavit dated 27.09.2024 on the subject cited above. The University has submitted attested copy of the **Telangana State Private Universities (Establishment and Regulation) (Amendment) Act, 2024 (Act No.11 of 2024)** which has been notified vide **Notification No.11 dated 30.07.2024** wherein **MNR University, Sangareddy, Gr. Hyderabad, Telangana** has been established as a State (Private) University, by the Govt. of Telangana. The **MNR University, Sangareddy, Gr. Hyderabad, Telangana** has come into force with effect from 30.07.2024 (Section 1(2) of the Act No.11 of 2024). Vide Affidavit dated 27.09.2024, the university has also submitted an Undertaking that it will not open/establish any off-campus without the prior and specific approval of UGC and the State Government.

Accordingly, the name of the University has been included in the list of Universities established as per Section 2(f) of UGC Act, 1956. The lists of all UGC recognized Higher Education Institutions (Universities and Colleges) are uploaded on the UGC website <https://www.ugc.gov.in> and may be accessed at the tab HEIs.

The University may note and adhere to the following:

1. The University shall follow the UGC (Establishment of and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulation, 2003, and other Regulations issued from time to time and posted on the UGC website.
2. The University shall follow the University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022, and as amended from time to time.
3. No Open and Distance Learning programmes and on-line programmes shall be started without the prior and specific approval of UGC. Relevant UGC Regulations are available on the UGC website www.ugc.gov.in.
4. The University shall not have any affiliated Colleges.
5. No off-campus centre(s) is opened by the University outside the territorial jurisdiction of the State in view of the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Prof. Yashpal Vs. State of Chhattisgarh. In case the University has already started any off campus centre outside the State, it must be closed down immediately.

6. The university shall not establish/open/affiliate/recognize any off campus or constituent college/unit outside the main campus of university, without the prior and specific approval of UGC.
7. The University must ensure that there is no franchising of higher education even for the purpose of distance education.
8. The University shall immediately appoint an Ombudsperson in accordance with UGC (Redressal of Grievances of Students) Regulations, 2023, for redressal of grievances of students preferably within two months of starting academic activities. The UGC (Redressal of Grievances of Students) Regulations, 2023 is available on the UGC website at link https://www.ugc.gov.in/pdfnews/4675881_Regulation.pdf. The details of Ombudsperson should be displayed on the website of university and sent to UGC also.
9. The University shall follow UGC guidelines on Public Self Disclosure by Higher Education Institutions which are available on UGC website at the link https://www.ugc.gov.in/pdfnews/7822003_GUIDELINES-ON-PUBLIC-SELF-DISCLOSURE-BY-HIGHER-EDUCATION-INSTITUTIONS.pdf
10. The university shall get necessary accreditation from NAAC.
11. The university shall register and upload the information of all students on Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) and National Academic Depository (NAD) portals of Ministry of Education, Govt. of India.
12. The University is empowered to award degrees as specified under Section 22 of the UGC Act through its main campus in regular mode only. However, prior approvals for running professional, technical and medical programmes shall be obtained from the respective Regulatory Councils/Commissions. Such programmes are governed by the norms of respective Regulatory Councils/Commissions and the approval of concerned Council/Commission is mandatory.
13. The university shall award only such degrees as specified by UGC. The University is required to follow the UGC Notification on Specification of Degrees 2014 and its amendments issued from time to time wherein consolidated list of UGC approved nomenclature of degrees has been specified under Section 22 of the UGC Act, 1956 wherein entry level of each degree and duration of programme have been provided. The approved nomenclature may be followed by the specific area of specialization to be reflected in the parentheses. This notification is available on the UGC website www.ugc.gov.in under the link https://www.ugc.ac.in/pdfnews/1061840_specification-of-degrees-july-2014.pdf
14. The inclusion of the name of the University in the list of universities maintained by the UGC does not by itself allow the University to make admissions in its programmes. This may be done only after creation of required academic and physical infrastructure facilities, including library, laboratories and appointment of teaching and supporting staff as per the norms and standards laid down by the UGC and concerned Regulatory Councils/Commissions.
15. The University is directed to submit detailed information (soft copy only in the prescribed format (available at UGC website at the link <https://www.ugc.gov.in/oldpdf/proformaprivateuniversities.pdf>) along with supporting documents duly attested by the Registrar of the University within a period of 3 months from the receipt of this letter. The University is also directed to upload the filled in format and appendices on its website by giving a link on the home page so that the information is accessible to the students and general public.
16. After receipt of the Information in the prescribed format, the following procedure would be adopted by the UGC for inspection of the University:
 1. The information received from the University in the prescribed format would be posted on the UGC website within 10 days of the receipt of the information. Comments received if any from the general public within 1 month thereafter about the information submitted by the University would be placed before the UGC Expert Committee for perusal.


down from time to time by the UGC and other concerned statutory bodies such as AICTE, BCI, NMC, DCI, INC, NCTE, PCI, etc.

- III. The UGC Expert Committee would inspect the University within 3 months of the receipt of the information for assessment of infrastructure and other facilities available with the University. The report submitted by the UGC Expert Committee would be sent to the University within 2 weeks of the completion of the visit for comments.
- IV. The University may respond to the report within a period of two weeks after its receipt. In case no comments are received from the University within the timeframe, it would be presumed that the University has no comments to offer and further action would be taken on the report. After receipt of comments from the University, the report and comments received from the University, if any, would be placed before a Standing Committee of the UGC. The recommendations of the Standing Committee would be then placed before the Commission for consideration.
- V. The Commission shall take final decision in the matter. It may require the University to submit further compliance report in respect of the observations/suggestions of the UGC Expert Committee/Standing Committee. The compliance report submitted by the University shall be placed before the Standing Committee and approval of the Commission.
- VI. On approval of the Commission, a letter would be issued by the UGC to the effect that the University fulfills the criteria in terms of programmes, faculty, infrastructural facilities, financial viability, etc. as laid down from time to time by the UGC and other concerned statutory bodies.
- VII. If it is found that the Private University has, even after getting an opportunity to do so, failed to comply with the provisions of the various UGC Regulations including UGC (Establishment of and maintenance of standards in Private Universities) Regulations, 2003 and suggestions given by the UGC Expert Committee, the Commission may pass an order prohibiting the University from offering any course for the award of the degree and/or the post-graduate degree/diploma, as the case may be, till the deficiency is rectified.

17. The UGC may also take necessary action against the university for not adhering to the Regulations, Guidelines of UGC and inform the public in general through a public notice/notification.

thanked everyone who contributed to the growth of MNRET and finally evolving into MNR University. - Research and Skill programmes should be given top priority for enhancing employability of the graduates and postgraduates
- Encouragement for achieving Patents and Publications by students and faculty for gaining national and international repute and for bringing laurels to the university

An effort has been made to prepare the Statutes keeping the 21st century requirements in view to offer quality higher education by the University. The First Statutes consisting of 73 Draft First Statutes were made by the Governing Body for submission to Government as per the following provisions contained in Section 26 (2) of the Principal Act.

Section 26 (2) : “ The First Statutes of the University shall be made by the Governing Body and shall be submitted to the Government for its approval.”

The first Statutes provide for the constitution, powers and functions of the university authorities, the terms and conditions of appointment of Vice-Chancellor, the manner, terms and conditions of appointment of Registrar and CFAO, the manner appointment of other officers, the terms and conditions of service of employees, the procedures for resolution of disputes, the conferment of honorary degrees, provisions for exemption of payment of fee and awarding scholarships, framing of admission policies and the fee to be charged from students

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



Agenda Item No 2:

Progress of the University after the previous Governing Body meeting

Resolution No 2 : The Governing Body expressed gratitude and grateful thanks to Government of Telangana for notifying the First Statutes and First Ordinances of MNR University for effective and smooth functioning of the university offering quality higher education. And also, after detailed deliberations, the Body resolved to acknowledge and approve the progress made by the university since the last Governing Body meeting. The following resolutions were adopted.

1. UGC Recognition under Section 2(f)

- The Governing Body appreciated the successful attainment of UGC 2(f) status, recognizing the university as per UGC norms. The decision to prominently display this status on the university website is noted and endorsed.

2. Association of Indian Universities (AIU) Membership

- The membership granted by AIU, effective from October 14, 2024, was noted. This step would enhance the academic collaborations and national/international recognition of the university's programs.

3. Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) Registration

- The inclusion of MNR University in the NAD portal and the successful registration of students for APAAR ID numbers under the ABC framework was acknowledged and commended.

4. All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) Participation

- The registration of MNR University on the AISHE portal for 2024-25 and the participation of university officials in the TGCHE workshop was noted with appreciation.

5. Institutional Memberships

- The university's successful acquisition of memberships in AIMA, HYSEA, and CSI is endorsed. The application for GEM membership and the ongoing process for final approval are noted.



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6. Commencement of Classes for SOET, SOPR, and SMHS

- The commencement of classes for the respective schools on the designated dates as per the approved academic calendar was approved and appreciated.

7. Appointment of Vice-Chancellor

- Adhering to quality and accreditation standards as stipulated in Section 3(4) of the Principal Act 2018.

The university shall identify a suitable location for the proposed center close to industrial clusters within Telangana following this approval.

The Governing Body placed on record its appreciation for the University's efforts and progress and advised the administration to continue strengthening academic, research, infrastructure, and international collaboration activities.



Hence, the Governing Body has considered and recommended the following.

1. **Scope Expansion:** Introduction of new programmes under existing and proposed schools such Business Management, Law, Architecture, Humanities and IKS, and Design—embedding AI, data science, legal tech, and digital humanities to offer holistic and multi-disciplinary and interdisciplinary education in the university as envisaged in NEP 2020 education followed by CCFUP, CCFPG of UGC keeping in view the Telangana's rising Infrastructure development and also national demands in the years to come
2. **Curriculum Design and infrastructure readiness:** Modular, credit-based, interdisciplinary curriculum with embedded AI tools and pedagogy, AI-integrated labs project-based learning, internships, and industry capstone projects.
3. **Governance Compliance:** The inclusion of new academic programmes under the “**Subsequent (Second) Statutes**” (Statute 50(g) to 50(m)) and “**Subsequent (Second) Ordinances**” (Ordinance 7.3(f) to 7.3(l)) to be submitted to the State Government for approval under Sections 27(2) and 29 (1) of the Telangana State Private Universities Act, 2018.
4. **School Renaming and Restructuring:**
 - Renaming of the *School of Engineering & Technology and Artificial Intelligence* to *School of Intelligence & Technology*
 - Renaming of the *School of Clinical Research, Medical and Health Sciences* to *School of Allied and Healthcare Sciences* as the programmes are regulated by NCHAP
 - Merging of the *School of Physiotherapy* into the *School of Allied and Healthcare Sciences* for alignment with NCAHP regulated programmes
5. **Fee Structure Approval:** Endorsement of the fee structure proposed by the Fee Fixation Committee (FFC) held on 14.06.2025, aligned with Statute 4(C)(28), accounting for AI driven digital tools and high-end labs, industry collaborations, internships for holistic and multi-disciplinary education. The proposed substantial hike in the fee of allied healthcare sciences programmes is consequent to the recent guidelines of NCAHP on FSR (1:5 to 1:10) and high end labs and equipment from AY 2026-27.

Resolution No. 5: Approved. The Governing Body considered the proposal and approved the introduction of a Bi-Annual Admission Policy at MNR University, beginning from January 2026, in accordance with provision in Ordinance No 3.24 of the notified First Ordinances and the directions issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC) vide letter No. F 1-2/2024 (CPP-II) (C No 143903) dated 19.06.2024 based on the recommendations of the Academic Council in its 3rd meeting held on 22.05.2025 vide Resolution No. (12) and the Board of Management in its 5th meeting held on 24.05.2025 vide Resolution No. (11).

The proposed Bi-Annual Admission Policy allows student intake during **July/August and January/February** each academic year, providing flexibility to students who miss a cycle due to personal or external factors. It is intended to:

- Improve access and inclusivity in higher education
- Contribute to India's GER (Gross Enrolment Ratio) target of 50% by 2035
- Enhance internationalization and optimize academic and infrastructural resources

Admissions will be based on CUET-UG, CUET-PG (conducted by NTA), MNRU's entrance exams, or other national/state-level entrance tests and qualifying examination marks, in accordance with the University's approved admission policy. The academic calendar, quality standards, and support systems will remain identical across both admission cycles.

The Governing Body **approved** the implementation of the **Bi-Annual Admission Policy** for all eligible programmes including Ph.D as provided in Ordinance No 3.24 of the notified first ordinances starting from **January 2026**, and authorized its inclusion in the University's regulatory framework.

Tech (Hons) Courses of 4 years duration:** Candidates must have passed in the qualifying examination at 10+2 System /Intermediate level/Equivalent examination with MPC group and admission is through marks in Qualifying Examination or TG EAPCET or any State Level Entrance Test or National Level Entrance Test or any other Equivalent International Qualification or Test based on Merit. Candidates must have completed 16 years of age as on 31st December of the year of admission.

MNR School of Clinical Research, Medical and Health Sciences

- **For all B.Sc (Hons) Courses of 4 years duration:** Candidates must have passed in the qualifying examination at 10+2 System /Intermediate level/Equivalent examination with BiPC/MPC group or 10th + Diploma (2 or 3 Years in the relevant technology) from any recognized Board or Institute or University and admission is through marks in Qualifying Examination or any State Level Entrance Test or National Level Entrance Test or any other Equivalent International Qualification or Test based on Merit. Candidates must have completed 17 years of age as on 31 December of the year of admission.
- **For all M.Sc (Medical) Courses of 3 years duration:** The candidate must be having an aggregate of 55% or above in graduation in a Biological Sciences stream from a recognized university.

After detailed deliberation, the following amendments were approved:

9.2 Mid-Semester Examinations (Amended)

Academic Rules: MNRU R24 (Amendment) - Re-evaluation of semester end examination answer scripts as recommended by the Academic Council for Approval

Resolution No. 8 : Approved the proposal to amend the existing regulation MNRU R24 concerning the re-evaluation of semester end examination answer scripts, with a view to enhancing clarity and addressing student concerns regarding the scrutiny and re-evaluation process , as recommended by the Academic Council (Resolution No. 8 in its 2nd meeting held on 26.11.24)

After detailed discussion, the following amendments were approved:

9.7 Scrutiny of grades (Amended)

(a) Re-totaling of marks:

The student may apply to the Registrar within one week after the announcement of the grades for scrutiny of the totaling of marks of the semester end examination or calculation of grade points obtained by him advancing sufficient reasons for such a request. The fee for such scrutiny shall be as prescribed from time to time.

(b) Re-evaluation:

The student who wish to seek re-evaluation of answer booklet of semester end examination shall apply through proper channel within 5 working days after the declaration of the results by the University. Any request beyond the specified period shall not be considered. On receipt of the requests from the students for re-evaluation through the concerned Deans, the University shall arrange to send such papers for re-evaluation to the approved panel of evaluators.

- (i) If the candidate fails in the examination and applies for re-evaluation, the highest total marks scored among original evaluation and marks obtained during re-evaluation shall be considered.
- (ii) If the candidate who has passed in the examination and applies for re-evaluation, and subsequently if the marks obtained due to re-evaluation are higher or lesser by >10% of original marks scored, then the highest marks scored among original evaluation and marks obtained during re-evaluation shall be awarded. However, if the difference is <10%, then original marks shall be considered.

In case, the marks obtained due to re-evaluation are >25% of the marks scored in original evaluation, the answer script shall be referred to the 3rd evaluator. Subsequently for awarding marks, the average of two re-evaluations shall be considered.



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The student seeking re-evaluation of answer script shall submit a application (along with the original receipt of prescribed fee) to the Dean of respective School. The amount of fee for re-evaluation per course shall be as decided in the Academic Council, which is subject for revision from time to time.

In case, the re-evaluation results of the student seeking promotion is delayed due to administrative reasons beyond the registration dates of the subsequent semester, then such students who become eligible shall be allowed for registration as a special case within 3 days of result declaration and the attendance shall be reckoned from that date.

The amended regulation shall be implemented with immediate effect and communicated to all concerned stakeholders

Approval of MNRU Academic Regulations and Examination Pattern (Amendment) as required in Statute 5 (d) (3) of the First Statutes of MNRU approved by Govt

Resolution No. 3 : Approved. The Board of Management reviewed the proposed amendments to the Academic Rules, Regulations, and Examination Patterns (MNRU R24) in accordance with the recommendations of the Standing Committee to the Academic Council and the UGC 2019 - Evaluation Reforms in Higher Educational Institutions. The Board recognized the importance of aligning academic policies with national



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regulatory frameworks and industry requirements to maintain high educational standards. After due consideration, the Board of Management approved the revised Academic Rules, Regulations, and Examination Patterns (MNRU R24), as recommended, which will be implemented for all Undergraduate Programs under MNR University with effect from the specified semesters during the academic year 2024-25.

- **Merger of Schools:** The School of Physiotherapy is proposed to be merged with the School of Clinical Research, Medical & Health Sciences, in principle, as the BPT and MPT course come under the regulations of National Commission for Allied Health Care Professionals (NCAHP)
- **Attendance Requirements:** Minimum attendance must be met per subject (B.Tech (Hons) - 75%, B.Sc (Hons) & BPT - 80%). Condonation fees apply for shortages.
- **Re-registration for Detained Students:** Students can re-register for detained courses by paying a fee and attending scheduled remedial classes.
- **Examination Structure:** Mid-semester exams are replaced with two class tests. Weightage revised to **CIE (70 marks) + SEE (30 marks)**. Theory SEE will be held for 100 marks (scaled to 30).
- **Promotion Rules:** As recommended
- **Supplementary Examinations:** To be conducted within 30 days of result declaration.
- **Marks for Attendance:** Students scoring >95% attendance will receive maximum of 10 marks and lesser marks for lesser attendance.

The Board of Management approved the revised Academic Regulations and Examination Pattern (MNRU R24) and directs the Academic Council and university to oversee its implementation in accordance with Statute 5 (d) (3) of the approved First Statutes.

Statute 16(a)(20) : Director (NEP Implementation & Accreditations)

- i. There shall be a Director (NEP Implementation & Accreditations) of the University, appointed from among the eligible candidates with suitable qualifications and experience, either through an open national advertisement or by the selection process as prescribed by the University.
- ii. The Director (NEP Implementation & Accreditations) shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor with the prior approval of the Chancellor and ratification by the Governing Body and Sponsoring Body, for a period specified by the University.
- iii. The Director (NEP Implementation & Accreditations) may be removed from office by the Vice-Chancellor on the grounds of misconduct, inefficiency, financial irregularity, or any other reason deemed detrimental to the interests of the University, with prior approval of the Chancellor and ratification by the Governing Body and Sponsoring Body.
- iv. The powers, functions, and duties of the Director (NEP Implementation & Accreditations) shall be subject to the approval of the Vice-Chancellor and the Governing Body, with ratification by the Sponsoring Body for all the following responsibilities:
 - 1) Implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 across the University, ensuring alignment with the policy's vision for holistic, multidisciplinary, and inclusive education.
 - 2) Coordinating and overseeing the development of academic strategies and reforms in accordance with the guidelines set forth by NEP 2020.
 - 3) Developing and implementing plans for the accreditation process with national and international accreditation bodies such as NAAC, NBA, ABET and other relevant regulatory authorities.
 - 4) Ensuring the compliance of all academic programs with accreditation standards and regulatory norms set by various agencies.
 - 5) Monitoring the quality and standards of education across the University and implementing systems for continuous improvement.
 - 6) Organizing workshops, training, and awareness programs for faculty and staff to ensure understanding and effective application of NEP 2020 policies.



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- 7) Collaborating with academic departments, university leadership, and external bodies to prepare documentation required for accreditation and evaluation processes.
- 8) Developing and maintaining a comprehensive system to track the University's progress in terms of accreditation and NEP implementation, ensuring timely reporting and assessments.
- 9) Advising the Vice-Chancellor on matters relating to NEP 2020 and accreditation, ensuring alignment with the University's long-term academic vision.
- 10) Coordinating with regulatory bodies and external agencies for conducting audits and assessments related to accreditation processes.
- 11) Acting as the main liaison between the University and accrediting bodies, ensuring clear communication and compliance with all necessary guidelines.
- 12) Ensuring the integration of feedback from accreditation bodies into the University's academic processes and operations to meet evolving standards.
- 13) Implementing measures to enhance quality in higher education to achieve ranks under NIRF, QS rankings and others
- 14) Performing all other duties as may be delegated and assigned by the Vice-Chancellor and Board of Management
- 15) Fulfilling any additional responsibilities as may be required by the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor or Registrar of the University.

v. The emoluments and other terms and conditions of service for the Director (NEP Implementation & Accreditations) shall be determined by the Governing Body and the Sponsoring Body.

Statute 16(a)(21) : Director (Civil)

- i. There shall be a Director (Civil) of the University, appointed from among eligible candidates with suitable qualifications and experience, either through an open national advertisement or by the selection process as prescribed by the University.
- ii. The Director (Civil) shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor with the prior approval of the Chancellor and ratification by the Governing Body and Sponsoring Body, for a period specified by the University.
- iii. The Director (Civil) may be removed from office by the Vice-Chancellor on the grounds of misconduct, inefficiency, financial irregularity, or any other reason deemed detrimental to the interests of the University, with prior approval of the Chancellor and ratification by the Governing Body and Sponsoring Body.

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iv. The powers, functions, and duties of the Director (Civil) shall be subject to the approval of the Vice-Chancellor and the Governing Body, with ratification by the Sponsoring Body for all the following responsibilities:

- 1) Overseeing the planning, execution, and maintenance of all civil infrastructure and construction projects of the University.
- 2) Ensuring the development of new buildings, renovations, and expansions in alignment with the University's master plan.
- 3) Managing and supervising contractors, consultants, and engineers engaged in construction, renovation, and maintenance activities.
- 4) Ensuring all civil works comply with regulatory norms, safety standards, and environmental guidelines as per local and national laws.
- 5) Coordinating with various University departments to assess infrastructure requirements and ensure smooth execution of civil projects.
- 6) Preparing budgets, cost estimates, and financial reports related to civil works, ensuring optimal utilization of funds.
- 7) Monitoring the quality and standards of construction work to ensure adherence to approved designs and specifications.
- 8) Developing and implementing maintenance plans for all University buildings, roads, drainage systems, and other civil infrastructure.
- 9) Conducting regular inspections and audits of University buildings and infrastructure to identify and address structural or safety concerns.
- 10) Advising the Vice-Chancellor and other University authorities on matters related to civil engineering, construction management, and infrastructure planning.
- 11) Ensuring the University's infrastructure remains resilient and sustainable through green building practices and innovative construction technologies.
- 12) Coordinating with regulatory bodies and government agencies for necessary approvals, permits, and compliance measures related to civil works.
- 13) Implementing measures for energy-efficient and eco-friendly infrastructure development.
- 14) Performing all other duties as may be delegated and assigned by the Vice-Chancellor and Board of Management.
- 15) Fulfilling any additional responsibilities as may be required by the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, or Registrar of the University.

The emoluments and other terms and conditions of service for the Director (Civil) shall be determined by the Governing Body and the Sponsoring Body.

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Statute 16(a)(22) : PRO VICE-CHANCELLOR

- i. There shall be a Pro Vice-Chancellor of the University who shall be appointed by the Chancellor from amongst the Professors with suitable qualifications and eligibility or through an open advertisement nationally.
- ii. The term of office of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall be three years and shall be eligible for re-appointment for another term.
- iii. He/She shall assist the Vice-Chancellor in academic, research, administrative and financial matters
- iv. He/She shall assist the Vice-Chancellor in respect of such matters as may be specified by the Vice-Chancellor from time to time, and shall also exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be assigned or delegated to him by the Vice-Chancellor
- v. He/She shall oversee specific portfolios such as academic programs, faculty development, and institutional partnerships.
- vi. He/She shall perform all duties and functions of Vice-Chancellor during the temporary absence of the Vice-Chancellor on the specific orders of the Chancellor.
- vii. He/She will attend to all other duties as may be specified by the Vice-Chancellor and Chancellor
- viii. The Pro Vice-Chancellor may be removed from the office by the Chancellor on the grounds of misconduct, inefficiency, financial irregularities or any other reason as may be considered against the interests of the university with prior approval of the Governing Body
- ix. The emoluments and other terms and conditions of the service of the Pro Vice-Chancellor shall be as decided by the Governing Body

Statute 16(a)(23) : THE PRO-CHANCELLOR

- i. There shall be a Pro-Chancellor for the university who shall be appointed by the Sponsoring Body for a period of three years from the date on which he/she assumes office
- ii. The Pro-Chancellor shall hold office for the period, as prescribed above or as determined sooner by the Sponsoring Body. The Pro-Chancellor shall be eligible for re-appointment.
- iii. The Sponsoring Body, if satisfied that the continuance of the Pro-Chancellor in the office is or shall be detrimental to the interest of the University, may remove the Pro-Chancellor before completion of tenure;



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- iv. The Sponsoring Body may suspend the Pro-Chancellor during enquiry depending upon the seriousness of the charges or as may be deemed fit.
- v. The Sponsoring Body may terminate the services of the Pro-Chancellor of the University for any misconduct or may impose any other punishment, as deemed fit
- vi. The emoluments, terms and conditions of service of the Pro-Chancellor shall be as decided by the Governing Body and ratified by Sponsoring Body.
- vii. In the absence of Chancellor, the Pro-Chancellor shall preside at the meetings of the Governing Body and also the Convocation of the University for conferring degrees, diplomas or other academic distinctions.
- viii. In the absence of Chancellor the Pro-Chancellor shall exercise all powers and functions of the Chancellor subject to ratification by Governing Body and Sponsoring Body
- ix. Such other powers and functions as may be assigned to her/him by the Governing Body, from time to time.

Agenda Item No 7

Approval for Industry Co-Branded Programmes with UGC Apprentice/Internship Embedded Framework to Enhance Quality Education and Employability of MNRU Graduates as per Statute 5 (d) (15) of the First Statutes of MNRU approved by Govt

Resolution No. 7 : Approved the introduction of the Industry Co-Branded Programmes, integrating the UGC Apprentice/Internship Embedded Framework which enhance the quality of education and the employability of MNRU graduates by providing industry-relevant skills, structured internships, and research opportunities. The following key programmes, in collaboration with industry partners were approved initially. The Board advised the university to explore such possibilities with other prominent organisations as well keeping the benefits for the university, staff and students in view.

- FinTech with Deloitte
- FinTech with Paytm
- AI with Fractal

The Board has complemented the university for taking up such an initiative. The Board also recommended to give some credits weightage and the degree programmes as may be decided by the University for the co-branded

programmes.

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

2. President of MNR University: The Board recorded that Sri M. N. Raju, Chairman, MNR Educational Trust, has been honoured as the President of MNR University.
3. 2nd Meeting of the Governing Body: The Board was informed that the 2nd meeting of the Governing Body was held on 20.03.2025, during which decisions were made regarding the courses to be offered during the academic year 2025-26. All other recommendations of the Board of Management were duly approved in the meeting.
4. Meetings of Boards of Studies (BoS): The Board acknowledged that the BoS meetings of Undergraduate Programmes under the School of

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Engineering & Technology (SOET), School of Medical & Health Sciences (SMHS), and School of Pharmaceutical Sciences (SOPR) were successfully conducted during 05.05.2025 to 19.05.2025, to finalize the course curriculum and syllabi for the academic years 2024-25 and 2025-26.

- Finalization of Architectural Plans and Commencement of Construction: The Board noted the finalization of architectural plans and drawings and the commencement of construction work for the Academic Complex and other University Infrastructure from 19.05.2025.

 - o **B.Sc (Hons) & BPT:** 80% minimum attendance
 - o **Condonation** with applicable fees for eligible shortages
- 3. Re-registration of Detained Students:** Students may re-register for courses upon payment of fees and attending mandatory remedial classes.
- 4. Examination Pattern:**
 - o **Class Tests** to replace mid-semester exams
 - o **Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE):** 70 marks
 - o **Semester-End Examination (SEE):** 100 marks (scaled to 30)
 - o Combined total remains at 100 marks per course
- 5. Promotion Criteria:**
- 6. Supplementary Examinations:** To be conducted within 30 days of result declaration.
- 7. Marks for Attendance:** Students with >95% attendance may be awarded up to 10 additional marks.

The Board appreciates the systematic and consultative approach undertaken by the Standing Committee and Academic Council in drafting these revisions to ensure academic excellence, equity, and alignment with global education standards.

The approved regulations and patterns shall be adopted and implemented across all Schools of the University from AY 2024-25.

Approval for Bi-Annual Admission Policy (from January 2026) for all Eligible Programmes Including Ph.D

Resolution No. 11 : Approved. The Board of Management has considered the introduction of a Bi-Annual Admission Policy for all eligible programmes, including Ph.D., at MNR University, effective from the January 2026 admission cycle.

This initiative is in line with the University Grants Commission (UGC) directions communicated through its letter No. F 1-2/2024 (CPP-II) (C No 143903), dated 19.06.2024, encouraging higher education institutions to adopt flexible admission practices to improve access and Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER).

The proposed Bi-Annual Admission Policy allows students to seek admission in two cycles each year – July/August and January/February – thereby offering improved access to higher education for those who miss a cycle due to delays in exam results, health issues, or personal circumstances.

This policy aligns with the University's commitment to:

- Enhancing student access and motivation for pursuing higher education;
- Contributing to national target of 50% by 2035;
- Optimizing the utilization of available infrastructure and faculty resources;
- Facilitating global collaborations and attracting international students.

Admissions for both cycles will be conducted based on:

- Scores obtained in CUET-UG and CUET-PG conducted by NTA, or
- University-conducted entrance tests, or
- Any national/state level entrance examination, or
- Merit in qualifying examination, as per the existing approved admission policies of the University.

It was further clarified that the quality of education, access to student support systems, and compliance with the academic calendar will be uniformly maintained across both admission cycles.

The Academic Council, in its 3rd meeting held on 22.05.2025, vide Resolution No. (12), has approved the Bi-Annual Admission Policy and recommended the same to the Board of Management for final approval under the powers conferred by Section 22(3) of the Principal Act and Statute 6(d)(2) of the *Trust Statutes.*

- **For all B.Sc (Hons) Courses of 4 years duration:** Candidates must have passed in the qualifying examination at 10+2 System /Intermediate level/Equivalent examination with BiPC/MPC group or 10th + Diploma (2 or 3 Years in the relevant technology) from any recognized Board or Institute or University and admission is through marks in Qualifying Examination or any State Level Entrance Test or National Level Entrance Test or any other Equivalent International Qualification or Test based on Merit. Academic Rules: MNRU R24 (Amendment) - Modalities in conduct of mid-semester examination and Special re-examination

Resolution No. 7 : Approved the proposed amendments to MNRU R24 governing the conduct of mid-semester examinations and special re-examinations for all UG programmes.

The Council considered the proposal to amend the existing regulation MNRU R24 to provide greater clarity and to benefit students, teachers, and staff regarding the conduct of mid-semester examinations and special re-examinations.

After detailed deliberation, the following amendments were approved:

9.2 Mid-Semester Examinations (Amended)

This re-examination shall be held within two weeks from the last date of mid-semester examinations, and shall be a common examination for all such students.</p>



The amended regulation shall be implemented with immediate effect and communicated to all concerned stakeholders.

Agenda Item.No.8

Academic Rules: MNRU R24 (Amendment) - Re-evaluation of semester end examination answer scripts

Resolution No. 8 : Approved the proposal to amend the existing regulation MNRU R24 concerning the re-evaluation of semester end examination answer scripts, with a view to enhancing clarity and addressing student concerns regarding the scrutiny and re-evaluation process.

After detailed discussion, the following amendments were approved:

9.7 Scrutiny of grades (Amended)

(a) Re-totaling of marks:

The student may apply to the Registrar within one week after the announcement of the grades for scrutiny of the totaling of marks of the semester end examination or calculation of grade points obtained by him advancing sufficient reasons for such a request. The fee for such scrutiny shall be as prescribed from time to time.

(b) Re-evaluation:


The student who wish to seek re-evaluation of answer booklet of semester end examination shall apply through proper channel within 5 working days after the declaration of the results by the University. Any request beyond the specified period shall not be considered. On receipt of the requests from the students for re-evaluation through the concerned Deans, the University shall arrange to send such papers for re-evaluation to the approved panel of evaluators.

- (i) If the candidate fails in the examination and applies for re-evaluation, the highest total marks scored among original evaluation and marks obtained during re-evaluation shall be considered.
- (ii) If the candidate who has passed in the examination and applies for re-evaluation, and subsequently if the marks obtained due to re-evaluation are higher or lesser by $>10\%$ of original marks scored, then the highest marks scored among original evaluation and marks obtained during re-evaluation shall be awarded. However, if the difference is $<10\%$, then original marks shall be considered.
- (iii) In case, the marks obtained due to re-evaluation are $>25\%$ of the marks scored in original evaluation, the answer script shall be referred to the 3rd evaluator. Subsequently for awarding marks, the average of two re-evaluations shall be considered.



The student seeking re-evaluation of answer script shall submit a application (along with the original receipt of prescribed fee) to the Dean of respective School. The amount of fee for re-evaluation per course shall

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be as decided in the Academic Council, which is subject for revision from time to time.

In case, the re-evaluation results of the student seeking promotion is delayed due to administrative reasons beyond the registration dates of the subsequent semester, then such students who become eligible shall be allowed for registration as a special case within 3 days of result declaration and the attendance shall be reckoned from that date.

The amended regulation shall be implemented with immediate effect and communicated to all concerned stakeholders.

Academic Rules: MNRU R24 (Amendment) - Modification in question paper pattern in mid semester examination

Resolution No. 9 : Approved the proposed modifications to the question paper pattern for the Mid-Semester Examination, specifically for the Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE). The proposal was made to adjust the existing pattern to reduce the impact of wrong answers on student scores and ensure fairness.

After thorough review, the Academic Council approved following policies:

- 1) **Admission Policy:** Framework defining eligibility, procedures, and criteria for student admissions to various programs.
- 2) **Examination Regulations:** Provisions for conducting examinations, evaluating student performance, and ensuring integrity in assessment.
- 3) **Multiple Entry and Exit Policy:** MNRU adopts this policy in a phased manner as per the provisions in NEP 2020, CCFUG, NHEQF and NCrF of the UGC Regulations
- 4) **Research and Innovation Policies:** Policies to promote high-quality research, foster innovation, and maintain academic integrity.
- 5) **Code of Conduct for Students:** A framework defining acceptable behavior and ethical standards for students on campus.
- 6) **Students Grievance Redressal Policy (SGRC):** Mechanisms for resolving student grievances promptly and effectively.
- 7) **Anti-Ragging Policy:** Measures to prevent ragging and create a safe, inclusive learning environment.
- 8) **Sexual Harassment Prevention Policy:** Guidelines for preventing harassment and ensuring a safe and equitable environment for all.
- 9) **Hostel and Mess Regulations:** Rules governing hostel facilities and mess services to ensure students' safety, hygiene, and comfort.
- 10) **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC):** Establishing a framework for the continuous improvement of academic and administrative standards.
- 11) **Fee Refund Policy:** Transparent guidelines for refunding student fees under specified conditions.
- 12) **Transportation Regulations:** Rules for the efficient management of transportation services for students and staff.
- 13) **Human Resource Policy:** Framework for faculty and staff recruitment, conduct, and professional development.
- 14) **Non-Disclosure Policy for Employees:** Provisions to safeguard institutional information and maintain confidentiality.





Resolution No. 7 : Approved. After due deliberation and in alignment with the University's vision of offering multidisciplinary, innovation-driven, and industry-relevant education as envisioned under NEP 2020, the Council hereby resolves to recommend the introduction of the following new undergraduate, postgraduate, and doctoral programmes across multiple schools of the University, effective from the academic year 2026-27.

The Academic Council has taken into account the growing demands for infrastructural development in the state of Telangana under the programmes of Telangana Rising and also National demands in the 21st century and accordingly recommended the introduction of the new programmes. Hence, some new programmes in Artificial Intelligence, Data Science and Engineering, Cyber Security, Robotics, Architecture, Planning and Design, Urban Technology & Sustainable Mobility, Semi-conductors and Nano-electronics are recommended to be introduced.

In line with NEP 2020, CCFUP and CCFPG of UGC that a holistic and multi-disciplinary education would aim to develop all capacities of individuals – intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional and moral in an integrated manner who possess critical 21st century capacities in fields across arts, humanities, languages, sciences, social sciences and professional, technical and vocational fields. Accordingly, some new programmes in Indian Knowledge Systems, Humanities, Business Management, Law, Performing and Creative Arts are recommended to be introduced.

The Council commends the University's initiative to expand its academic offerings in alignment with State and National priorities, technological advancements, rising infrastructure demands and future workforce needs. The Council recommends the undermentioned programmes for the AY 2026-27 as per the Section 29 (1) of the Principal Act 2018 for placing before the Board of Management for approval, and for submission to Government for final approval in the form of Second Ordinances.



The Second Semester of all Undergraduate (UG) Programmes, and

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- The First Year (Semesters I & II) of Postgraduate (PG) Programmes offered under the School of Medical and Health Sciences (SMHS).

The Council acknowledged that the syllabi were meticulously prepared by the respective Deans, in consultation with subject matter experts and industry stakeholders, and were duly reviewed and recommended by the respective Boards of Studies (BoS), in accordance with Statute 6(d)(2).

The Council also appreciated that the syllabi are aligned with academic standards, outcome-based education principles, and the emerging needs of the respective disciplines.

Agenda Item.No.9

Approval of Revised Academic Rules, Regulations, and Examination Reforms (MNRU-R24)

Resolution No. 9 : Approved. The Council reviewed the recommendations of the Standing Committee to the Academic Council, which held its first meeting on 12.02.2025, to deliberate upon the revision of Academic Rules, Regulations, and Examination Patterns for all **Undergraduate (UG) programmes** under the **MNRU R24 regulation**, proposed for implementation from the **Academic Year 2024-25**.

The Council acknowledged that the revisions were made in line with:

- The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 guidelines,
- Contemporary academic and industry expectations, and
- The need for greater academic flexibility, transparency, and learner-centric approaches.

The major revisions noted by the Council include:

- **Merger of Schools:** The School of Physiotherapy has been integrated into the School of Clinical Research, Medical & Health Sciences.
- **Revised Attendance Requirements:** B.Tech (Hons) students must maintain 75% attendance, and B.Sc (Hons) & BPT students 80%; condonation of shortage will be subject to fee payment.
- **Re-registration Policy:** Provision for detained students to re-register for courses with payment and remedial class attendance.
- **Modified Examination Pattern:** Mid-semester exams are replaced with two class tests; revised weightage – **CIE (70 marks) and SEE (30 marks)**, with SEE theory exam conducted for 100 marks (scaled down to 30).
- **Promotion Criteria and Rules:**
Supplementary Examinations: To be conducted within 30 days of the declaration of results.



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- **Attendance-Based Marks:** Up to 10 marks awarded for students with >95% attendance, with proportionate marks for lower attendance levels.

The Academic Council approved the revised Academic Rules, Regulations, and Examination Patterns (MNRU R24) for all Undergraduate programmes, as recommended by the Standing Committee.

The approved document shall be implemented from the Academic Year 2024-25 and communicated to all concerned departments for strict adherence.

Agenda Item.No.10

Approval of Admission Eligibility Criteria for UG Programmes – AY 2025–26

Resolution No. 10 : Approved. The Council considered the recommendations of the 2nd Meeting of the Standing Committee to the Academic Council, held on 28.03.2025, which reviewed and finalized the **admission eligibility criteria for all Undergraduate (UG) programmes** across various Schools at MNR University for the Academic Year 2025–26.

The Council noted that the eligibility criteria have been framed by taking into account:

- Existing norms and regulatory frameworks,
- University's academic vision and standards, and
- National educational and professional guidelines.

Based on the proposal submitted, the Academic Council **approved** the **Admission Eligibility Criteria for UG Programmes for AY 2025–26**, as detailed below:

Approval of Skill-Based and Multidisciplinary Programmes in Line with UGC Guidelines

Resolution No. 11 : Approved. The Council considered the proposal submitted for the introduction and approval of new **Skill-Based and Multidisciplinary Programmes** at MNR University, prepared in alignment with the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020** and the latest **University Grants Commission guidelines**.



The Council acknowledged the importance of these programmes.

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- Enhancing student employability,
- Promoting innovation and creativity,
- Providing students with broad, flexible, and interdisciplinary academic exposure, and
- Aligning curriculum with national skill frameworks and emerging industry needs.

The Council noted that the programmes have been developed after comprehensive consultation and review of industry demands, academic best practices, and national policy directives to ensure relevance and quality.

Resolved that:

1. The Academic Council **approves in principle** the launch of new Skill-Based and Multidisciplinary Programmes across various departments of the University as per the submitted proposal.
2. The detailed structure, syllabus, and implementation plan of these programmes shall be presented for review and final approval in the forthcoming Academic Council meeting.
3. The University shall ensure that these programmes integrate practical hands-on learning, industry-relevant skills, and interdisciplinary approaches consistent with UGC guidelines and NEP 2020 objectives.

Agenda Item.No.12

Approval for Bi-Annual Admission Policy (from January 2026) for All Eligible Programmes Including Ph.D

Resolution No. 12 : Approved. The Academic Council approved the implementation of the Bi-Annual Admission Policy at MNR University, commencing from the January 2026 admission cycle based on the following factors.

The Bi-Annual Admission Policy allows student intake during **July/August and January/February** each academic year, providing flexibility to students who miss a cycle due to personal or external factors. It is intended to:

- Improve access and inclusivity in higher education
- Contribute to India's GER (Gross Enrolment Ratio) target of 50% by 2035
- Enhance internationalization and optimize academic and infrastructural resources



Admissions will be based on CUET-UG, CUET-PG (conducted by NTA), MNRU's entrance exams, or other national/state-level entrance tests and qualifying examination marks, in accordance with the University's approved admission policy. The academic calendar, quality standards, and support systems will remain identical across both admission cycles.

Examination/ Evaluation System in MNR University

5.7 Details of the Examination system

(a) The detailed course outlines in each course shall be prepared by the concerned teacher(s) in consultation with the Head of the Department/ Dean, which will be made available to the students during the first week of the semester. A schedule of the class tests of the academic programme shall be prepared by the Dean and notified to the students at the beginning of each semester.

(b) In case of courses with theory and practical integration, marks allotted for theory and practical shall be in proportion to the credits for the theory and practical. The proportion of marks for the Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and the Semester End Examinations (SEE) shall be 70:30 respectively. Marks for the practical shall be based on record including continuous evaluation of practical classes and a final practical examination which shall include a *viva-voce* examination.

The proportion of marks between Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) of practical work and final practical examination shall be in the ratio of 70:30.

(c) Semester End Examinations

(i) The Semester End Examinations (SEE) shall be held at the end of each semester in each course. The semester end examination in the theory portion shall be of three (3) hours duration. It shall be responsibility of the University to conduct the theory portion of semester final examination involving external faculty..

(ii) A student with 60% physical disability will be allowed a "scribe" on his/her request.

(d) The following academic requirements have to be satisfied, in addition to the minimum 75% attendance requirements

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5.8 Methods of evaluation of answer scripts

EVALUATION - DISTRIBUTION AND WEIGHTAGE OF MARKS

- a) The performance of a student in every subject/course (including practical and Project Stage – I & II) will be evaluated for 100 marks each, with 70 marks allotted for CIE (Continuous Internal Evaluation) and 30 marks for SEE (Semester End-Examination).
- b) In Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) for theory subjects, for a total of 70 marks there will be Component A (*two class tests for 70 marks*), Component B (*Quiz/ Viva-voce/ Home Assignments/ S & GD Learning/ Addl. Assignments/ Poster presentations at 3 Learning levels for 70 marks*) and Component C (*Attendance for 10 marks*) for a total 140 marks, reduced to 70 marks
- c) The semester end examinations (SEE) for theory subjects, will be conducted for 100 marks consisting of two parts viz. i) Part- A for 40 marks, ii) Part - B for 60 marks and will be reduced to 30 marks, involving external faculty in Q.P. setting/ Moderation and Online Evaluation
- d) For practical subjects, there shall be Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) during the semester for 70 marks, and 30 marks for the Semester End Examination (SEE) with the duration of 3 hours. In case any student abstains from CIE component in practical subject on ill health conditions, the evaluation re-examination will be made on production medical certificate. However, the decision of the Dean of the School concerned will be final whether to conduct the CIE evaluation component or not.

The Semester End Examination shall be conducted with an external examiner and the laboratory teacher. The external examiner will be appointed from other colleges, as decided by the examination branch of the University.
